



Have 5 students each hold a rubber duck and act out the song. There are lots of yellow rubber ducks available, but I found these on Amazon.




About the song:

This song is a traditional children's song that is known all over the world. It was translated into many different languages like German, French, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish. This song includes a finger play in which the fingers show the five or less ducks. The hills are represented by the hand doing waves, portraying the shape of hills and the "Quack" of the mother duck is demonstrated by opening and closing the hand where the top is the little, ring, middle and index finger and the bottom the thumb. <u>Here</u>, you can find an example of the finger play with the song.

The song is especially for younger children but can also be used with older children for example when they have to play a song on instruments.





SONG INFO

"Finger Family" is one of the most popular nursery rhymes and baby songs. It's a rhyme in repetitive form (the text stays same for every turn, with only a small part of a verse change every time). As with all Finger Family songs, Singing Bell's version presents all 5 fingers of a hand as a family with five members.





Breakmixer: "walk and stop" (the dwarfs in the wood) *Goal: reacting; Music- no music*

Pizzicato from: Delibes

Goal: Reaction (tempo), Dynamics of music (a sudden sforzando); legato and pizzicato.

Tip: use a story: the children ar waling in the forest/city on the playground etc.

- Movements, with supporting text
 - I rather like to hop on music than to walk
 - We.....
 - 13 "fiches" (slips/cards) or "kruidnoten" (Dutch traditional cookie-like confectionery that is eaten around Sinterklaas).

After every sforzando ("ploem") children lay a card in front of them; or......

Papageno and Papagena – Duet from Die zauberflote (The Magic Flute) – Mozart *Goal: listening to timbre*

Use a puppet theatre and two puppets: Puch and Judy (Dutch: Jan Klaassen en Katrijn)

Preperation:

Divide the class into two groups: e.g. boys & girls. Use a well known song with sections. Two pupils (or teacher with a pupil) in the puppet theatre. When Puch appears: the boys are singing; same with Judy. Sometimes the puppets appear together......

Challenge:

The puppets will change idealistic on a logical moment (= difficult, however not impossible....)

We use a recording of the Mozart's Duet.

Jan Klaassen reacts to the voice of Papageno, Katrijn on Papagena's. First time is not easy! But: as soon as the class knows the song and when to react they want to play it 30X..... Have fun!
